

This book contains a glimpse into the surroundings and adventures of Daniel N. Klinck, U. S. Army, during his tour of duty at Trois Fontaines Ordnance Depot, Vassincourt Sub Area. This depot stored enough ammunition to last a division a month in actual combat. It is located in Eastern France, eight miles from Bar-le-Duc, Meuse, and is equidistance between Paris and Strasbourg.














Quonset Hut Construction (46 units), September 1956 – November 1956











The Polish guards each used a German Shepherd on duty and these were kept on the Post at the Dog Area. A few guards caught young Wild Boar while at the Depot:


Vassincourt Sub Area The Post:

The Post consisted of Company A, 97th Engr Bn (Const); 520th Light Truck Company and three Labor Service companies. Company A provided general construction work for the Ordnance Depot. The 520th Lt. Truck Co, consisting of sixty 2-1/2 provided cargo trucks, ton transportation for the many local French laborers to and from the Depot. The Labor Service Companies were used to furnish guards for the Depot and some general labor. The personnel were mostly Polish, who for political reasons did not wish to return to Poland after World War II.












